
Poker machines were introduced and the Club's first three were installed but they took so long to be connected that Barry Stedman and Heather Brown draped them with "cobwebs".

Ladies 25th Anniversary at a special function Heather Brown as Ladies President cuts the cake with Evelyn Low and Daphne Liddy Then it was time for a game


